# SEVEN DOCTRINES OF SALVATION

(Compiled by Ernest Thomas from notes of James V. Clark – 15 June 2000)

Through the precious work of Jesus Christ, God reconciled (Romans 5:10-11, Colossians 1:20 & II Corinthians 5:18-20) to Himself all saints (New Testament believers). There are seven very important aspects or doctrines of God's reconciliation of man to God. Each of these shows the completeness of a saint's salvation.

## 1. REDEMPTION:

Romans 3:24  
Ephesians 1:7

Jesus purchased (with His Blood) believers from being slaves of sin.

## 2. EXPIATION:

Colossians 2:14

By reparation or payment for a crime or sin, the crime or sin is cancelled or removed.

## 3. REGENERATION:

John 3:3

Believers are born again with everlasting life into God's Family.

## 4. PROPITIATION:

Romans 3:25  
I John 2:2

Mercy Seat – Jesus provided to The Father a satisfactory sacrifice in behalf of the believers.

## 5. IMPUTATION:

Romans 3:22  
Romans 4:3-6  
Romans 4:8-11  
Romans 4:22-24  
II Corinthians 5:21

Jesus' righteousness is credited to the accounts of the believers. Thus, even when a saint acts unrighteous, he or she is STILL considered righteous before God.

## 6. POSITION IN CHRIST:

I John 5:11-12  
Philippians 3:9

The Holy Spirit permanently places (invisibly and spiritually) believers into Christ Jesus.

## 7. JUSTIFICATION:

Romans 3:24  
Romans 5:1

God's declaration that a believer has been made right and is now acceptable before God.
